

Items in Dept. 113-122 are exhibited in the 4-H Building. For all 4-H Building exhibits in these departments, the following rules will apply.

- All 4-H members entering items in the 4-H Building must submit their project and record books for inspection. Books must be completed to an acceptable degree. **Members entering items in the 4-H Building must present their books during face-to-face judging between 4 and 6 p.m. on July 28th.** 4-H'ers participating in face-to-face judging must present their own books.
  - Items exhibited in the 4-H Building will be judged twice: once at face-to-face judging, where the judge will assign a score and a corresponding 4-H Merit Ribbon for the item, accompanying book, and interview; and once by Clinton County Fair judges, who will place the items in each class for the purpose of awarding placing ribbons and premiums.
  - A 4-H'er must be enrolled in a bona fide 4-H project relating to every exhibit, display, or item that he/she enters in the 4-H Building. He/she must also bring the acceptably completed project (and, if applicable, record) books to face-to-face judging in order to enter items in the building.
  - Youth exhibiting animals at the fair who wish to enter related items (i.e., displays, posters, etc.) in the 4-H Building may bring their books to book check. Because they will experience live judging during animal shows, they are not required to participate in face-to-face judging (although they are welcome to do so.)
  - Where posters or exhibits are offered as options for exhibition, they may not exceed the following sizes: Posters must be 30" by 24" or smaller\*, while displays must fit within a footprint of 12" deep by 30" long. Larger craft items (such as large woodworking projects) are permitted. (Note that club educational exhibits are NOT covered by this rule. Educational exhibits must fit on an 8' table.)
- \*Youth interested in entering posters elsewhere should note that PA Farm Show poster requirements differ.
