GENERAL RULES

1. 4-H Club or FFA members must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging.
2. Showmanship - The purpose of the show is to enable youth to have a satisfactory experience in the show ring. Therefore it is the responsibility of the 4-H and FFA exhibitor to show their own animals. The only exceptions that will be allowed are:
 - If sickness or physical injury after arriving at the show prevents the owner from showing their own animal(s). In the case of a previous injury or illness prohibiting and exhibitor from showing, a doctor's excuse will be required.
 - If the exhibitor has two animals in the same class or animals in another 4-H or FFA show.
 - If an exhibitor finds it impossible to attend due to scholastic or military commitments, the 4-H Educator or FFA Advisor must provide written permission for the use of a substitute showman. Band, chorus, sports, and similar activities will not be excused.
3. Substitute Showman
 - Anyone other than the owner showing an animal must be another Clinton County 4-H/FFA member.
 - A substitute showman must be another 4-H or FFA member of the same age or younger.
4. Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the superintendent; to keep the stall assigned without controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance; and to cooperate with the department in every way that may serve to increase the educational value of the show.
5. Exhibitors of dairy animals must inform themselves as to when their animals will be judged. Cattle must be in the ring promptly on call and a failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out of competing.
6. Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by the animal at a show will be prohibited until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judge.
7. Exhibitors must have animals listed for competition on the grounds between 7:00 AM and 4:00 PM on Monday, July 31, 2017. (All such animals shall remain on the premises until after the conclusion of the Jr. Livestock Sale.)
8. The exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all their equipment promptly as the superintendent may direct.
9. Tag number and animal information must be recorded in writing with the Extension Office on the Official Entry Form by July 5 (No telephone or facsimile entries will be accepted.)
10. Exhibitors may show more than one animal per class.
11. All cattle must be registered.
12. Straw/bedding must be supplied by the exhibitor.

SECTION 20
4-H and FFA
Dairy Fitting and Showmanship

1. 4-H and FFA members may show an animal in the Fitting and Showmanship contest provided it has been carried as a project and is owned by the exhibitor.
2. The exhibitor must show an animal in both contests.
3. Only other 4-H'ers, leaders, and immediate family, from Clinton County clubs may provide assistance in restraining animals for the fitting competition. The exhibitor must perform all other fitting requirements.
4. Once the animals arrive at the Clinton County Fair, only immediate family, other 4-H'ers and leaders from Clinton County may assist with animals.
5. An exhibitor found in violation of the General and Fitting Rules, as determined by the livestock committee, will have their animal disqualified from the Show and the Livestock Sale and the animal will be marketed through the buyback program.

NOTE: In large shows the best 4-H and FFA fitters and showmen may be selected during the showing of the type classes then only these become eligible to compete in the Fitting and Showmanship contest. In small shows, all 4-H and FFA members showing can compete in the Fitting and Showmanship contests.

4-H and Vocational Beef Cattle General Rules and Regulations

1. When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and under the command of the owner or owner's representative.
2. Showmanship - The purpose of the Show is to enable youth to have a satisfactory experience in the show ring. Therefore it is the responsibility of the 4-H and FFA exhibitor to show their own animal. The only exceptions that will be allowed are:
 - If sickness or physical injury after arriving at the show prevents the owner from showing their own animal(s). In the case of a previous injury or illness prohibiting an exhibitor from showing, a doctor's excuse will be required.
 - If the exhibitor has two animals in the same class or animals in another 4-H or FFA Show.
 - If an exhibitor finds it impossible to attend due to scholastic or military commitments, the 4-H Educator or FFA Advisor must provide written permission for the use of a substitute showman. Band, chorus, sports, and similar activities will not be excused.
3. Substitute Showman
 - Anyone other than the owner showing an animal must be another Clinton County 4-H/FFA member.
 - A substitute showman must be another 4-H or FFA member of the same age or younger.
4. Cattle must be owned by the exhibitor listed on the entry card at the time of the show.
5. All breeding cattle must be tagged and/or tattooed and registered with their respective breed association.
6. All cattle must comply with Health Rules, as stated.
7. Owners of vaccinated cattle should note product restrictions because of residue that may result from vaccinations.

4-H and Vocational Beef Breeding Classes

Beef Breeding Rules:

1. Breeding animals must be identified by ear tag, ear notch or tattoo.
2. Tags are provided by the Extension Office, Steers use B.A.I. Tags.
3. Lost tags should be replaced within seven (7) days.
4. Number of entries in the breeding classes is not currently restricted.
5. Tag number and animal information must be recorded in writing with the Extension Office on the Official Entry Form by July 5 (no telephone or facsimile entries will be accepted.)
6. Purchased breeding projects should be purchased before May 15 of the current year.
7. Crossbred and Purebred animals will have separate championship drives.

SECTION 15

4-H AND VOCATIONAL MARKET STEERS

Market Steers General Rules:

1. Due to weight variances and weight limits, the number of weight classes will be set at the Fair.
2. All market animals must be identified with a permanent ear tag.
3. Tag number and animal information must be recorded in writing with the Extension Office on the Official Entry Form by February 15 (no telephone or facsimile entries will be accepted.)
4. Tags are provided by the Extension Office for hogs, goats and lambs. Steers use B.A.I. tags.
5. Lost tags should be replaced within seven (7) days.
6. Exhibitors may use any combination of market steers and/or dairy beef to tag three (3), show two (2), sell (2.)
7. Steers must be tagged by February 15.

8. Minimum weight to sell is 1,000 lbs.
9. No heifers in the market class.

3. All market animals must be identified with a permanent ear tag.
4. Tag number and animal information must be recorded in writing with the Extension Office on the Official Entry Form by February 15. (No telephone or facsimile entries will be accepted.)
5. Tags are provided by the Extension Office. Steers use B.A.I tags.
6. Lost tags should be replaced within seven (7) days.
7. Exhibitors may tag three (3), show two (2), sell two (2) Market Steer and/or Dairy Beef.
8. Steers must be tagged by February 15.
9. Minimum weight to sell is 1,000 lbs.
10. No heifers in the Market Class.
